SDAO recommends the following tips to help keep your drivers safe and accidents down:

- Take familiar routes
- Conduct 360° inspections of vehicles prior to use
- Be familiar with the vehicle you will be driving
- Always wear your seat belt
- Set controls and mirrors before leaving
- Back into spaces when possible
- Be aware of your surroundings
- Scan road ahead for hazards and changing conditions
