Ballot Measure 102	Referred by Legislature (HJR 201)	Amends Constitution: Allows local bonds for financing affordable housing with nongovernmental entities. Requires voter approval, annual audits	<b>Pass – 56%</b> Fail – 44%
Ballot Measure 103	Ron Brake Syd Hannigan	Amends Constitution: Prohibits taxes and/or fees based on transactions for groceries enacted after September 2017	Pass – 43% <b>Fail – 57%</b>
Ballot Measure 104	Alan Mehrwein Art Kegler	Amends Constitution: Requires majority vote of all members in each House to pass every bill; 3/5ths of all members in each House to pass bills to raise revenue; and defines revenue as any tax or fee increase, whether accomplished by the creation, imposition or increase of any tax or fee, or by the modification, elimination or change in eligibility for any exemption, credit, deduction or lower rate of taxation	Pass – 35% <b>Fail – 65%</b>

Greg Barreto	Overturns the law that requires Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents to obtain a federal criminal arrest warrant for undocumented immigrants for state or local law enforcement agencies to be required to turn them over to ICE	Pass – 37% <b>Fail – 63%</b>

Measure 26-199 Metro District Affordable Housing Bond	Metro	Will cost property taxpayers in Multnomah, Clackamas and Washington Counties an extra \$0.24 per \$1,000 of assessed value	<b>Pass – 59%</b> Fail – 41%
